



KASL's Registration Procedures and Information for New Recreational Players



KASL General Information:

Age Brackets:

KASL has players both male and female playing in its program ranging from ages of 3 to adults. Our age chart follows the school year since our full season is Fall / Spring. Currently, KASL players are divided into these brackets.

Coed Divisions: U-4's U-5's U-6's U-7's U-8's U-9's U-10's U-11's U-12's U-13/14's U-15/19's

Girls Divisions: U-5/6's U-7/8's U-9/10's U-11/12's U-13/14's U-15/19's

Adult Divisions: Must be 18 prior to playing.

Our girls and some coed divisions run in multiple year brackets.

Registration Requirements / Needs:

1. Complete the 2 page "Registration Form"
The form is on our website under "Registration".
In the Excel version, download the form, complete it, print it and sign it.
THIS IS THE BEST WAY FOR ACCURACY.
In the PDF version, print it out, complete the information (print clearly) and sign it.
No forms unsigned will be accepted.
2. Bring a birth certificate when you register (State requirement; we only need to verify it once).
Current players in KASL do not need to do this unless we contact you.
If mailing in a copy of the birth certificate once it is verified it will be shredded.
3. New players may call or email ahead to be placed on a team.
Spots are not guaranteed until paperwork arrives; only held for 2 weeks.
4. You must pickup your two \$10.00 discount cards at the KASL office.
We will not mail them or give them to your coaches.
5. Pay in full or make a payment plan with KASL when you register (no credit cards).
A \$50.00 per player up front payment is due to register (no exceptions).
6. Illinois players must complete an Illinois release form.
The link is on the KASL website; under "Registration".
No player may be placed on a team without this release.
If one parent has a Wisconsin address, use that one to avoid this fee (State Rule).
7. If you complete #1, #2, #5 and #6 by mail; you are registered to a team; as long as openings remain. KASL shall not be held responsible for lost or stolen mail.

Fees and Refund policy:

See "Fees and Refunds" on the website under "Registration".

The registration fee includes the insurance, state fees/dues, full uniform, etc.

It also includes the two \$10.00 discount cards.

Fundraiser (Discount Cards):

You will notice that your total fee included two \$10.00 discount cards. The fundraising portion is to cover the two cards you will receive when you register and pick up at the KASL office.

You may keep and use the cards or sell them for \$10.00 each and receive the cash back. The reason for the fundraiser is to add drain tiles. After we've reached our goal, KASL will again see if its membership wishes to pursue any new projects or cancel the fundraiser.

Cybercollect:

KASL uses Cybercollect for returned checks and there is a \$35.00 fee charged.

Registration Deadlines Returning Players:

1. All players must reregister for next season(s) program (there is no spring/fall combined).
2. You must register by the final scheduled game.
3. The website has the office hours posted (also posted on the office window)

You may also register on any Saturday/Sunday when the office is open during games.

Returning Players "Why wait to register":

1. Register early, to avoid the long lines on the last scheduled game day.

Returning Players Who Register After the Final Game:

1. After the final game, a \$25.00 late fee shall be assessed. Why:
 - a. Prevents adults from recruiting kids (before the late fee, it happened all too often).
 - b. KASL also needs to know a uniform count or pay higher fees, and # of teams.
2. After the final game, no spot is held for any returning player or friend/coach request.
3. All players who miss the deadline may still register, but must go on the lowest roster.

Registration Deadlines for New Players:

1. None, but recommend the sooner the better.
2. Once teams are set, new teams are not formed and only open positions are filled.
3. Once a division is filled, players will then be placed on a waiting list.

Season Duration:

- 1: Fall and Spring: September to the end of October then re-starts in April till mid June.
- 2: Fall Only: September to the end of October.
- 3: Spring Only: April till mid June

Game days:

1. Saturday's: games start at 9:00am till 6:00pm - majority of the games are done by 5:00pm.
2. Sunday's: games start at 12:00pm till 7:00pm - majority of the games done by 6:00pm
3. Weekdays: usually only if weekends are rained out and Sunday's are full or requested.

Practice and Game Day Policies (set by KASL, WYSA State and USSF)

1. All players must wear shinguards during practices and at games.
Recommendation; purchase ones with padding around the ankle.
2. Players may wear regular tennis shoes or soccer cleats (rubber spikes).
Baseball, Football, Golf or Rugby cleats are not permitted.
3. During cold weather, players may wear knit hats or gloves (no scarves or baseball gloves).
4. During cold weather, players may wear warm clothing under the uniform (no jeans).
5. If desired, a mouth guard maybe worn if nothing is sticking out.
6. If desired, head gear maybe worn if sanctioned (ex- Full 90).
7. If desired, only keepers may wear soft brimmed hats, soft padded knee and elbow pads.
These items must be removed when entering as a field player.
8. No hard casts of any form; doctors may not give an ok to play.
9. No jewelry of any type.
This includes **no taping** of earrings.
Removing new earrings for one hour has been deemed safe by dermatologist.
Only rubber bands or scrunches are allowed to be worn in hair.
10. Medical necklace or bracelet is allowed.
All but face plate must be taped to the skin.
11. KASL is a FREE ZONE; so, no alcohol, smoking or drugs during any KASL events.

No pets: There are no pets allowed at Anderson Park during a KASL event.

Exception to the Rule: Only service dogs with the proper identification will be allowed to remain on the premises - a dog vest, service dog patch sewn to a vest, personalized service dog certificate or a wallet card. The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) defines a service animal as any guide dog, signal dog, or other animal individually trained to provide assistance to an individual with a disability.

Practices / Games / Playing Time:

1. The maximum a coach can practice is 2 nights a week for an hour and a half each night.
 - a. The days, times and location are set by the coach.
2. Being a recreational program, each player is guaranteed 50% playing time.
3. Coaches may have playing time rules if submitted and approved by KASL.
4. Coaches usually start to practice two weeks prior to the first game.

New Team Formation and Waiting List:

1. KASL will form a new team as long as:
 - a. There are enough players.
 - b. The schedules have not been finalized.
 - c. A volunteer coach is found for the team.
2. Once teams are set, KASL will fill them with players in the order received.
 - a. Do not call during office hours, come into the office.
3. After an Age Division is full, a waiting list is started and players are added:
 - a. When a current player drops, the first one on the waiting list is added.
 - b. During midseason, if enough player are on the waiting list, a new team will be formed.

Website / Emails:

1. All schedules / reschedulements are posted under "Schedules"
2. All rainouts are posted first on the website's scroll bar and then emails are sent out.
3. Communication is all done via email; coaches/managers/team parents are expected to pass the information on to all of their players.
